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





It's easy to get here and around town. Here's how.



Card makes it easy to use Vancouver's modern, clean and safe public transportation system, whether you travel by bus, SkyTrain, or SeaBus.

SKYTRAIN: TransLink's automated light-rail transit system connects downtown Vancouver with nearby municipalities Burnaby, New Westminster, Surrey and Richmond. The Canada Line whisks riders from Vancouver International Airport to three downtown stations in about 25 minutes. The new Evergreen Line extension now goes to Port Moody and Coquitlam.

Take a self-guided walking tour and hit the highlights

etting to Vancouver is easy and exhilarating. You'll land at the airport (filled with First Nations art), cruise into into the harbour or arrive along rural and urban roads. Choose your own walkable adventure, whether you have a few hours to explore or more.

LOCAL INTEL

Andre Kalil



As Visitor Experience Specialist at Tourism Vancouver, Andre offers up his list of favourite ways to explore the city.

- HANGOUT SPOT: It is always a good time to spend a morning at Granville Island, surrounded by water, diverse and tasty food, local and international art and happy people enjoying their time.
- HIDDEN ATTRACTION: I absolutely love the Sewell's Marina Sea Safari, a mix of adventure and learning in the unique Howe Sound area.
- BEST VIEWS: Grouse Mountain in the evening. One of the greatest moments I had in this city was my first time snowboarding at night.
- PLACE FOR A DRINK: For coffee, Arbutus Coffee in Kitsilano.
 It's a charming local place with good-quality products. I also appreciate the local breweries Steamworks and Parallel 49.
- BEST-KEPT SECRET: Leeside Tunnel skateboard park. This abandoned tunnel has evolved into an amazing place for skateboarding with lots of street art.



ARCHITECTURAL ICONS Experience a wealth of the city's landmarks, all within a short walk of the Visitor Centre.

 Vancouver Convention Centre/ Jack Poole Plaza: Start with a stroll to the Vancouver Convention Centre. This modern, glass-fronted, waterfront building has Canada's largest living roof, home to some 400,000 native plants and 240,000 bees. Look for the Olympic Cauldron in Jack Poole Plaza outside.

ON SCREEN: The street outside the Convention Centre doubled as Mumbai during filming of *Mission*: *Impossible – Ghost Protocol.*

2 Canada Place: Make your way east to Canada Place's iconic five sails with cruise ships anchored in front. For a full-on visceral experience, head inside to FlyOver Canada, a virtual flight ride over spectacular landscapes.

GOOD TO KNOW: Join more than a million people expected to help mark Canada's 150th anniversary of Confederation. Canada Place will be at the heart of the birthday bash in Vancouver, with performances, cuisine and other cultural festivities that honour our country's diversity.


 Vancouver Lookout: Spot the circular observation deck of Vancouver Lookout perched above Harbour Centre, which offers views of city, mountains and sea. Make a pitstop at the Top of Vancouver Revolving **Restaurant** and take in the 360-degree panorama.

 Marine Building: For a shorter walk, head west to Burrard St. to see the 1930s Art Deco–style edifice that was once the tallest building in the British Empire. Retrace your steps to the Visitor Centre.

GOOD TO KNOW: Join a summer walking tour led by the Architectural Institute of British Columbia to see a sampling of architecture styles downtown.







Gastown icons: For a longer stroll, head east into Gastown, pausing for selfies (use the #veryvancouver hashtag) at the Steam Clock on Water St. and the statue of John "Gassy Jack" Deighton where Water and Carrall streets converge.

Skinny structure: Detour to Chinatown (walk south on Carrall St. / and east along Pender) to the Sam Kee Building, the world's shallowest office building, less than 1.5 metres deep.

SHOP AND DINE

Easygoing Vancouver melds casual coastal style with local couture and its exciting culinary scene seems to follow suit. Get your fill of both as you explore.

Secret Location: Backtrack from the Sam Kee Building and turn west on Water St. where you'll find this concept store. Here, shop for nextbig-thing clothing brands and lifestyle items like luxury candles.

GET THE SCOOP: Stanley Park Horse-Drawn Tours offers a narrated tour of the park's sites such as Deadman's Island and the *Girl in a Wetsuit* statue.



3 Waterfront Centre Shops: Find an array of stores and services that includes both a tailor and a shoe repair for quick fixes. Two names synonymous with Vancouver style are nearby: Leone, for ready-to-wear (pop into its Italian bistro downstairs for pasta and a cappuccino) and Eco Fashion Week, held every April at the Fairmont Waterfront hotel. Make your way back to the Visitor Centre or continue walking west.

WILD WATERFRONT WANDER

Nature lovers will be enamoured with the city's wealth of wildlife.

Stanley Park: Starting at the Visitor Centre, wander west (or hop on a bike) along the waterfront to Vancouver's beloved urban park, home to wild beavers and one of North America's largest colonies of Pacific great blue herons. After taking in a Theatre Under the Stars performance at Malkin Bowl, rest your legs and have a bite or beverage at Stanley's Bar and Grill in the Stanley Park Pavilion.

Wancouver Aquarium: Get a look at life in our coastal waters. Search for the reclusive octopus and see rescued marine mammals such as sea otters.

LOCAL INTEL

The *House of Cards* actor and co-owner of the Alexander Gastown bar, who divides his time between Vancouver and L.A., divulges his secret spots.

- BEST-KEPT SECRETS: My secret spots are all outdoor spots, preferably dog-friendly, like CRAB Park at Portside, Quarry Rock in Deep Cove and High View Lookout at Cypress Mountain.
- MY PERFECT DAY IN VANCOUVER: It starts with coffee at **Milano Gastown** for a pour-over or Americano. Then I'll make my way to **Chambar** for some waffles and a delicious brunch. If I'm close to the seawall I can't think of a better way to spend the day than biking, running or strolling.
- WHAT I MISS MOST ABOUT VANCOUVER: For me it's the food, sushi specifically. We tend to forget the abundance of restaurants, thanks to the diversity here. I love Sake Maki on Commercial Drive and noodle houses like The Ramen Butcher in Chinatown and Legendary Noodle on Denman Street. And Tavola, an Italian restaurant in the West End.
- COCKTAIL: I love The Keefer Bar in Chinatown. It's an intimate, dark venue and I always feel like I'm walking into the movie version of *Blade Runner* when I go in there. Tableau Bistro at the Loden Hotel is off the beaten path.

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Explore more of the city by the sea

Whether you're a foodie, adrenalin seeker or outdoor enthusiast, venture beyond the downtown core for an immersive experience

INCREDIBLE EDIBLES

Vancouver is a hungry city so do as locals do and fuel up! Indulge in Vancouver's massive food truck scene or get out on the water – ride the SeaBus from downtown across Burrard Inlet to North Vancouver's **Lonsdale Quay Market**, where you can graze on treats from one of the 80-plus marketplace shops.

Or head east into the belly of Chinatown for a cultural and culinary tour, dim sum included, with A Wok Around Chinatown. Nearby is Railtown where Off the Eaten Track leads an urban culinary tour.

COOK IT YOURSELF: Take a hands-on cooking class at Pacific Institute of Culinary Arts (near the Granville Island entrance) led by professional chefs.

ADRENALIN RUSH

Pack both land and sea adventures into a long day. Spot humpback, orcas or minke whales (depending on the season) with **Prince of Whales Whale Watching** from Coal Harbour or **Wild Whales Vancouver** at **Granville Island**.

Or go further afield with Steveston Seabreeze Adventures or Vancouver Whale Watch in Richmond. Trips travel along the Fraser River Estuary. Then move from water to land at Cypress Mountain and hit the hiking and biking trails.

PACK IT ALL IN: Take a summertime Evening Combo Tour with Vancouver Trolley Company to the Capilano Suspension Bridge and Grouse Mountain on the North Shore.

LOCAL INTEL

Bif Naked



The rock star and writer reveals a few of her fave Vancouver places.

- EAT: I will always recommend
 The Naam Restaurant to everyone (even if a person or group is not vegetarian or vegan, go for the house dressing on a house salad). It has been my favourite restaurant in Vancouver since 1989 and always will be!
- OUTDOORS: A walk over by Kits Beach along the seawall (and if you're ambitious, you can walk from Kits Beach, past Granville Island, past Science World to English Bay, Stanley Park and back again!). It is so incredibly beautiful it has to be physically felt: feet on earth.
- NIGHTLIFE: Rickshaw Theatre. The live venue is absolutely integral for Vancouver's music scene and has one of the most eclectic calendars every month, from showgirl cabarets to Norwegian death metal to surfer pop to jazz to pure Canadian punk.

SOUNDS OF THE CITY

It's easy to be enchanted by the city's sights but be sure to listen for its iconic urban time signals.

Noon

Every 15 minutes

Wait for the signature whistles (and steam) of Gastown's celebrated Steam Clock. This is a #veryvancouver selfie spot.



Hear the airhorns atop **Canada Place** sound the first four bars of "O Canada."



9 p.m.

Listen to the boom (and see the blast) of the Nine O'clock Gun on the Stanley Park seawall.



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Cultural liaisons

The city proves there's an art to living well

Ancouver's seaside location and gorgeous views have informed the work of internationally acclaimed homegrown artists like Douglas Coupland and Rodney Graham, inspired designers such as Omer Arbel and John Fluevog and fired the imagination of tech titans like Slack's Stewart Butterfield and Hootsuite's Ryan Holmes. It also enticed the TED Talks series organizers to invite thought leaders to meet here annually until 2020.

PUBLIC ART

Discover massive outdoor sculptures made by international luminaries. Here are five to see.

CURATED COLLECTIONS

Delve deeper into the city's history at the **Museum of Vancouver**. Its collection of artifacts and curiosities chronicle Vancouver's evolution.

At the Vancouver Art Gallery downtown, touring exhibitions complement more than 10,000 permanent pieces, including those of celebrated turn-of-the-last-century post-impressionist, Emily Carr. Nearby is the Bill Reid Gallery of Northwest Coastal Art, which has permanent and rotating collections.



ENTERTAINMENT OUTDOORS

Vancouver's great outdoors plays a role (literally!) as the backdrop for the **Bard on the Beach Shakespeare Festival**. Granville Island welcomes global indie theatre performers at the **Vancouver Fringe Festival**, music fills the air at the **Vancouver International Jazz Festival** and Jericho Beach celebrates its groovy past by hosting the **Vancouver Folk Music Festival**.

LOCAL INTEL

Kathleen Bartels



The director of the Vancouver Art Gallery reveals three of her favourite public artworks.

- LIGHTSHED BY LIZ MAGOR: This striking, off-kilter sculpture in Coal Harbour reflects a moment in history when the waterfront was very different. It's wonderful to discover that every seemingly familiar detail of this half-size version of a century-old freight shed was cast in aluminum.
- MONUMENT FOR EAST VANCOUVER BY KEN LUM: To me, this iconic beacon at West 6th Ave. and Clark Dr. represents the pride of East Vancouver. It's a symbol of the social, economic and political diversity in this part of the city.
- The BIRDS BY MYFANWY MACLEOD: I always enjoy seeing the two towering sparrows standing guard in the Olympic Village! Using a dramatic shift in scale, the artist has cleverly created works that are beautiful, thought-provoking and maybe even a little frightening.

Museum of Anthropology Celebrates Northwest Coast Indigenous Masterworks

The Museum of Anthropology is world-renowned for its beautiful Northwest Coast Indigenous masterworks. Highlights include Bill Reid's famous sculpture, *The Raven and the First Men*, towering outdoor totem poles carved by Bill Reid and Doug Cranmer, and over 6,300 other First Nations objects. Thanks to a generous donation from a private collector, as well as funding from the Doggone Foundation and the Government of Canada, this collection is now even more impressive.

Visit the Museum of Anthropology, known to locals as MOA, to admire its Gallery of Northwest Coast Masterworks, a new exhibition space that opens to the public on June 22, 2017. The opening exhibition will showcase rare and culturally significant Northwest Coast artworks, some of which date back over 1,000 years.

View, close up, works like the fragment of an ivory knife handle that depicts a man transforming into a bear, or a tobacco pipe carved into the image of a hungry bird. Ponder how these pieces may have been used, where they've travelled and what significance they held.

Our goal is to shift how museum visitors look at and relate to the works shown

Sink into an Idea Chair to hear Northwest Coast Indigenous people describe the works through their perspectives as artists, dancers and activists. Discover the meaning behind pieces and how they relate to today's issues, like the protection of Indigenous land and the importance of salmon to communities. Learn what Haida ancestor artist Charles Edenshaw's silverwork means to his grandchildren today.

"Our goal is to shift how museum visitors look at and relate to the works shown," says Jordan Wilson, MOA's Musqueam curator in residence. "Through audio, text and film, we're creating a conversation that embraces the voices of many different Northwest Coast Indigenous people," he says. "Beyond the artistry of each piece,

we're looking at the relationship to the land and people that these pieces expressed throughout history and what they speak to today."

"There are many questions about what these pieces represent and who made them, so the opportunity to build knowledge around them is what makes this collection so exciting," says Karen Duffek, MOA curator of contemporary visual arts and Pacific Northwest. "It's important to showcase these works and see how they continue to teach new generations and open up new ways of thinking about Northwest Coast art and ideas."

"These masterworks have travelled all around the world and have now returned to their home on the Northwest Coast," Jordan adds. "That's what makes this donation so important and full of potential."

The Museum of Anthropology is Canada's renowned museum of world arts and cultures. Hours: 10 a.m.-5 p.m. daily, until 9 p.m. Thursday. Closed Mondays from Oct. 15–May 15. Discover First Nations heritage

Explore the legends and living traditions of the coastal peoples

housands of years ago First Nations' ancestral lands were flush with cranberries, rivers were thick with salmon and cedar totem poles bearing families' crests framed longhouses. With 203 First Nations bands living in B.C., these connections to the land run deep. Here are some iconic ways to discover First Nations culture.



SEE

The totem poles in Stanley Park are examples of visual language and an alluring entry point to First Nations culture. *Go deeper:* visit the **Bill Reid Gallery of Northwest Coastal Art**, named for one of Canada's most acclaimed artists. Here, see Reid's 8.5-metre bronze *Mythic Messengers.*

The Museum of Anthropology at UBC offers an immersive look at Northwest Coast First Nations the moment you enter the Great Hall. See pieces from Coast Salish, Gitxsan, Nisga'a, Haida and Kwakwaka'wakw peoples, including bentwood boxes.

EXPLORE MORE: Visit Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre in Whistler to see the 40-foot-long Salish hunting canoe, named Nexws Chachu7.

EXPERIENCE

For a history lesson on the Tsleil-Waututh First Nation, paddle Indian Arm in a 25-foot canoe with **Takaya Tours**. Or take a Talking Trees Tour in Stanley Park with **Aboriginal & Eco Tours**.



EAT

Salmon n' Bannock Bistro honours First Nations foods like bannock bread with cedar jelly and delectable Indian candy made from wild salmon.

SHOP

Coastal Peoples Fine Arts Gallery in Gastown sells museum-quality pieces such as Isabel Rorick's spruce root Frog Basket. In North Vancouver visit Khot-La-Cha Art Gallery & Gift Shop to find contemporary eagle-motif bags by Corrine Hunt (she co-designed the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Games medals).

LOCAL INTEL

Grace Dove



The Revenant actress shares her favourite places to discover First Nations culture in Vancouver.

- SKWACHÀYS (PRONOUNCED "SKWATCH-EYES") LODGE: It houses a fair trade gallery, boutique hotel and an urban aboriginal artist residence. Other features include a sweat lodge and smudge room used for spiritual cleansing.
- VANCOUVER ABORIGINAL FRIENDSHIP CENTRE: The centre emphasizes the philosophies and values of varied aboriginal cultures and traditions. There is Pow Wow Family Night on Tuesdays and West Coast Family Night on Wednesdays. I also play women's drop-in basketball; everyone is welcome.

STAY

Bed down at **Skwachàys Lodge**, an aboriginal boutique hotel featuring the Urban Aboriginal Fair Trade Gallery and a sweat lodge. Its 18 suites each tell a cultural story, such as the Moon Suite, which explores the relationship between the Moon and Raven – a trickster god.

GET FESTIVE: During Canada's 150th birthday, celebrate First Nations heritage at two events. *At the beach:* Take in the Gathering of Canoes festival (July 19–22) to witness 5,000 canoe families stop at Jericho Beach as part of the annual Tribal Journeys event. *In the city:* Go to The Drum Is Calling Festival (July 22–30) at Larwill Park, on the corner of Cambie and West Georgia streets in downtown Vancouver, for performances and to explore life-sized First Nations villages. tourismvancouver.com/canada150

Vancouver's original 'hood has hip eateries, hot boutiques and haute home furnishings

ancouver's oldest neighbourhood with cobblestone-street charm is named after John 'Gassy Jack" Deighton, a ribald seaman who opened the first saloon here in 1867. Pay tribute to his statue on the corner of Water and Carrall streets opposite the iconic flatiron building (both are #veryvancouver selfie spots), then explore the narrow lanes and brickwork of what's now a National Historic Site of Canada.

Secret Location

SHOP

Designer row: Versace Home Store adds an extra cool factor to Gastown's growing hub of high-end homeware - and this flagship is the luxury brand's first one worldwide. Head to Inform Interiors for modern brands like Flexform, Vitra and Bensen (designed by founder Niels Bendsten).

Fashionable fix: Lifestyle boutique and fashion mecca Secret Location offers dozens of exclusive international brands. LUMAS on Water St. is a

temple to photography, representing work from international artists.

EAT

Between fashion and homeware shopping, refuel at Pourhouse Restaurant. It has sexy speakeasy style and a menu to match (hello, rabbit terrine with mustard and bread and butter pickles). Nicli Antica Pizzeria brings a slice of Italy to Vancouver as the city's first VPN-certified Neapolitan pizzeria (gluten-free dough is an option).

DRINK

Gastown also has a burgeoning brew scene, in beans. While exploring the streetscape get caffeinated at Milano Gastown. The long-standing local pioneer in coffee-making and -roasting has an espresso tasting bar, where you can try an award-winning miscela.



For something stronger, go to Chill Winston for creative craft cocktails such as the Ritual Sacrifice. made with Victoria Gin, Aperol, grapefruit tea, lemon and peach bitters. Then wander outside and down the stairs to Guilt & Co. where live music goes well with its inventive cocktails, like the A Little Rain.

Chinatown

Traditional tea shops mingle with next-generation eateries

hinatown is a bubbling hot pot of flavours begging to be sampled. Head east of downtown and glass towers give way to narrow alleyways that once were the cultural hubs of Chinese immigrants. Gold dragons still dance on lamp posts, but many modern businesses have set up shop, injecting new life into old. Here are great ways to get fully immersed in the mix of tradition and trend.

EAT

Taste of tradition: New Town Bakery has been turning out steamed buns stuffed with barbecued pork since 1980, while the thousand-seat Floata Seafood Restaurant is a destination spot for authentic Hong Kong– style dim sum staples such as pork *shui mai*.

New generation: Duck into Sai Woo and chow down on sumptuous bites such as Hakka noodles with pork confit. For Southern-tinged American food, head to Mamie Taylor's and tuck into its lifeaffirming fried chicken and waffles.

SHOP

Taste of tradition: At the Aisin-Gioro Fine Art Gallery, sample the official Emperor's tea and find Qing dynasty and Manchurian-style artifacts to purchase. The director of the museum-style gallery is artist Cecilia Aisin-Gioro, a descendant of the Qing Dynasty royal family.

New generation: Designer Erin Templeton transforms "unloved" leather into covet-worthy handbags at her eponymous boutique. The Modern Bartender is a temple for cocktail enthusiasts with a selection of items from bar spoons to shakers.

EXPLORE

New generation: Reserve a visit at Rennie Collection at Wing Sang to see one of Canada's largest contemporary art collections hidden in Chinatown's oldest building, built in 1902.



STCOAST

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Mount Pleasant

This East Vancouver village lives up to its charming name

Forget about glamour and glass; **Mount Pleasant** on Vancouver's East Side has unvarnished charisma. Low-rise buildings hug its buzzing artery, Main Street, with most of the shopping and dining stretching from Broadway to King Edward. Here, a blend of local boutiques, breweries, antique shops, homespun bakeries and hip cafes cozy up against one another. In-your-face murals add extra character and colour to the community.



EAT & DRINK

Mount Pleasant's restaurants are eclectic and exciting, spanning the globe from east to west.

Veg out: The Acorn has received accolades from the *New York Times* for its revelatory vegetarian dishes (try its pâté) and sexy decor. Cocktails are perfected too, with drinks like The Royal, made with B.C. distilled Stump Gin, St. Germaine Elderflower Liqueur and green chartreuse, among other ingredients.

Go global: Satisfy your craving for spice at East Is East Chai Lounge (try the Tibetan mantu) and finish up with liquid dessert: chocolate chai. Nearby, chow down on Peruvian-inspired tapas and pisco sours at Chicha.

Keep it casual: The Cascade Room offers a tasty take on classic Britmeets-West-Coast, with gastropub fare (go for Sunday roast dinner), local beer and a long cocktail list, including sips like the London Calling.





SHOP

Boutiques bursting with local fashion abound on Main Street. Smoking Lily, a stalwart since 2002, still uses vintage fabrics and non-toxic ink on its clothing. Still Life sells cool kicks by Vancouver's own Native Shoes and Devil May Wear brings its eco-friendly fashion to conscious consumers.

PLAY

Mount Pleasant embraces its artful side. Write a letter on a typewriter at Regional Assembly of Text. Take

lessons (no experience necessary!) at Goh Ballet, which offers drop-in dance classes. And visit Fox Cabaret; it has shed its infamous grit and been reborn as a hotspot for independent acts, like comedy shows and DJs.

OFF THE BEATEN PATH: Relax in Dude Chilling Park (two blocks east of Main on Brunswick at East 7th Avenue). Officially called Guelph Park, it got its #veryvancouver nickname when a guerrilla artist's prank sign stuck.

GOOD TO KNOW: Join the party during the Main Street Car Free Festival (June 18) for live music, street food and more.

WORTH THE DETOUR

Three reasons to head north on Main Street to Olympic Village.

1 Shop: Visit

Portobello West, a seasonal market with local fashion, food and art at Creekside Community Centre.



2 Learn: Explore the interactive exhibits at Science World British Columbia.



3 Drink: Sidle up to the bar at CRAFT Beer Market for session ales.

Get your fill of West Coast food from surf to turf and farm to table

Resh, local, seasonal. Those three little words pack a powerful punch in describing West Coast cuisine – a celebration of B.C.'s bounty. Chefs find fresh ways to honour ingredients like sweet Dungeness crab, plump berries, wild mushrooms and more.

LOCAL INTEL

Wayne Sych



The **Joe Fortes** executive chef shares three of his favourite local ingredients.

- FRESH HALIBUT AND HALIBUT CHEEKS: The season starts in the spring; to me, it really is the start of the fresh, local bounty. The slightly sweet taste of the fish makes it a popular choice for many chefs and diners.
- B.C. SPOT PRAWNS: Wild and sustainable, nothing beats fresh spot prawns. This delicacy is known around the world for its sweet, delicate flavour and firm texture. We buy our spot prawns from Organic Ocean and serve them whole, simply poached with fresh herbs, lemon and butter.
- FRESH BERRIES: Raspberries, strawberries and blueberries are always on Joe Fortes' menu during berry season, starting in early summer. We buy them from various farms in the Fraser Valley.

SURF

At Joe Fortes Seafood & Chop House, a city institution since 1985, executive chef Wayne Sych crafts seafood classics (think oysters Rockefeller) and modern fare like his miso-marinated sablefish with sesame quinoa, mushrooms, edamame, kale and sweet soy.

On the seawall at the foot of Howe St., Ancora Waterfront Dining & Patio is where you'll find executive chef Ricardo Valverde imparting Japanese and Peruvian influences into his signature seafood tower, the Ancora Glacier. Find Dungeness crab causa mingling with high-grade sashimi (prepared by star sushi chef Yoshihiro Tabo), plus local oysters.

SUSTAINABLE SEAFOOD: Look for the Ocean Wise label, an initiative launched by the Vancouver Aquarium in support of sustainable fishing practices and embraced by chefs like Blue Water Cafe's Frank Pabst.

FEAST

Three more ways to get your food fix.

• Meet the farmers: Vancouver's seasonal farmers markets are scattered across the city, including winter markets at Hastings Park (at the PNE) and Nat Bailey Stadium. Go to Eat Local online (eatlocal.org) to find out what's cropping up. **2** Take a food tour: Eat your way through or around Granville Island Public Market with Vancouver Foodie Tours. The market is brimming with fresh fish, handmade pasta, organic produce and decadent doughnuts.



TURF

Cacao is a newcomer to the city, with Chef Jefferson Alvarez expertly fusing Latin American flavours and cookery techniques with West Coast ingredients (think bison and elk), culminating in hearty dishes such as bison asado negro.

Eric Pateman, chef, president and founder of **Edible Canada**, helped put deeply local food on the culinary map with creations that feature ingredients like Pacific giant octopus, organic kale and local and sustainable mussels.

LOCAL INTEL

John Bishop



The chef and owner of **Bishop's** dishes on the local ingredients he likes to work with.

- FRESHLY STEAMED DUNGENESS CRAB: Served whole with lemons and a homemade mayonnaise as a dipping sauce.
- QUADRA ISLAND KUSSHI OYSTERS: Freshly shucked and served on shaved ice with a shallot and apple cider mignonette.
- FILET OF WILD SPRING SALMON: Lightly grilled and served with steamed baby new potatoes.
- SALT SPRING ISLAND MUSSELS: A large bowl, steamed, with warmed baguette.

ancouver's many dens give you great reasons to drink up, especially with its top-notch bartenders shaking and stirring up artfully crafted cocktails. Here are five places to keep the party going from morning to night.

COCKTAIL HOURS

RISE AND SHINE

Lineups at **Café Medina** aren't just for the Belgian waffles, but for brunchtime wake-up cups like the Samanyolu, a hybrid of gin, fresh strawberries and house breakfast tea syrup.

2 LIQUID LUNCH /

Feeling peckish? **Chambar**'s The Blue Fig pairs a martini of house-made-figinfused gin with a side of blue cheese.

3 AFTERNOON DELIGHT

The Fairmont Pacific Rim's Lobby Lounge is where ladies who lunch meet high flyers of finance. If budget allows, a \$490 Royal Sazerac celebrates the marriage of Louis XIII Cognac, salted absinthe, Peychaud's Bitters and lemon oil.

HIGH FIVE (O'CLOCK)

Sabrine Dhaliwal holds court at Uva Wine & Cocktail Bar, stirring up whistle-wetters like Peater Rabbit, a mix of Famous Grouse blended scotch, Laphroaig Quarter Cask, red vermouth, boreal cordial and Cascade Celery Bitters from local brand Bittered Sling.

6 NIGHTCAP

True to its name, **Juniper** boasts a gin-forward bar with a rotating list of local distilleries and aromatics. Try the Catalan, a G&T made with B.C. gin, Fever-Tree Mediterranean tonic water, grapefruit and a giant sprig of fresh thyme.





ROOMS WITH BREWS

Vancouver's craft breweries are clustered around the city, with Main St. and its surrounding avenues as one of the go-to areas. The 19thcentury Brewery Creek 'hood that disappeared in the 1920s has a new generation of craft beer tasting rooms.

The Steel Toad Brewing Company off Main St. in Olympic

HOP ON BOARD: Vancouver Brewery Tours offers a rotating

schedule of three-hour brewery tours across Metro Vancouver.

MUSIC AND MYSTERY

Live music venues draw diverse crowds to their compact environs while the new escape room craze tests players' puzzle-solving prowess.

Downtown: Opened in 1929, the Commodore Ballroom is still the place to take in concerts by locals like Matthew Good and international artists such as Sting. The Roxy has also long been at the heart of Vancouver's entertainment district, with its house band covering classic songs and new hits. For adventurous entertainment outside, collect clues on downtown streets as you solve a mystery with Vancouver Mysteries. Village serves pints of its Oatmeal Stout in a restored industrial building. Farther west is **Big Rock Urban Brewery & Eatery**, which has signature beers such as its Citradelic Single Hop IPA. Deeper into Mount Pleasant is the hipster-approved **Main Street Brewing Co.**, which pours a proper British Westminster Brown.



Gastown: At Guilt & Co., a cozy basement bar, get up close to musical acts at pay-what-you-can prices. Nearby, five themed escape rooms challenge players at SmartyPantz, including Doomed Submarine 2.0.

Kitsilano: Jazz fans can sip champagne or scotch while listening to live acts like Bruno Hubert Trio perform at the new Blue Martini Jazz Cafe on Yew St.

SUPER SIPPERS

With 277 wineries (and counting) B.C.'s wine scene has earned international awards. Here are three ways to get grapes in your glass.

ATTEND A FESTIVAL

Compare B.C. wines to international offerings at the Vancouver International Wine Festival (it's on in February/March), one of the oldest and biggest wine events worldwide. STOCK THE CELLAR Shops such as Village Wines and Swirl Wine Store exclusively sell B.C. wines and offer free in-store tastings, often from new or little-known wineries.

\delta TAKE A TOUR

Get the grapes-to-glass experience at Lulu Island Winery in Richmond, starting in the vineyard and finishing up with ice wine tastings. Vine & Hops Wine and Craft Beer Tours takes budding oenophiles behind the scenes at Fraser Valley wineries.



RAINBOW CONNECTION

With its rainbow crosswalk, bright-pink bus shelters and the new Jim Deva Plaza at Davie and Bute streets, the West End's Davie Street Village is the playground of the LGBTQTS (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning and two spirit) community. Here's where the party is on any given night.

Monday: Queer Prov – Sketch comedy at XYYVR Tuesday: Shame Spiral – Genderbending fabulousness with Peach Cobblah at 1181

- FAVOURITE LOCAL SPIRIT: Sheringham Seaside Gin. This distillery does it right: clean, crisp and fresh. With locally harvested kelp, it brings a true flavour of local terroir.
- SECRET INGREDIENT: Ice. As chefs cook with fire, bartenders create with ice. We have many styles, shapes and sizes of ice at Prohibition. When creating a seemingly perfect cocktail, the choice of ice used is always the secret!
- FAVE COCKTAIL TO MAKE: Ramos Gin Fizz. I have a secret when it comes to making the cocktail perfect: it's the ice. When you make it just right, the presentation and flavour are both stunning.
- FAVE COCKTAIL TO DRINK: Pegu Club (Sheringham Seaside Gin, Cointreau, lime juice and a dash of Angostura aromatic bitters). It's liquid refreshment.
- FAVOURITE BAR IN VANCOUVER: Keefer Bar. It's the best! It comes down to the choice of music, a talented Italian barman making my Negroni, hand-carved ice cubes and a spirits collection that boggles the mind, with rarities in every category. Everything is done right.

SUMMER IN THE GAYBOURHOOD: Vancouver Queer Film Festival screens hundreds of international films and the Vancouver Pride Parade and Festival – Western Canada's largest – takes to the streets.

Street eats

Vancouver's laid-back but food-focused vibe makes for lots of fab food to grab on the go

oaming food trucks serve a gourmet round of Vancouver's diverse culinary influences. Download the free **Street Food Vancouver** app to pinpoint where the 100-plus trucks are parked or hit up a stationary take-out spot instead.



ON WHEELS Here are five food trucks to try.

Mexican: Tacofino's food truck, emblazoned with the Virgin de Guadalupe, is the go-to for tasty tacos. *Try*: Classic Baja-style fish taco with crispy ling cod, cabbage, salsa *fresca* and chipotle mayo.

Indian: Take a tour of Indian cuisine at Vij's Railway Express, another offering from chef Vikram Vij of Vij's and Rangoli fame. (It won the People's Choice Award for *enRoute* magazine's Best New Restaurant in Canada.) *Try*: Butter chicken schnitzel.

Asian: The pan-Asian flavours of Le Tigre became such a hit, its chef opened a permanent restaurant, Torafuku. *Try:* Angry Kitty Cat Squares of crispy fried rice, kimchi, basil, spicy mayo and nori.

Tacofino food truck

Locavore: Sample über West Coast, plant-based drinks at The Juice Truck, Vancouver's first cold-pressed juice company. *Try*: Almost Chocolate smoothie, made with banana, medjool dates and almond milk.



Japanese: The Anthony Bourdain-approved Japadog is one of Vancouver's original gourmet street-food carts. *Try*: Negimiso dog sprinkled with seaweed and slathered with wasabi-mayo.

LOCAL INTEL

Vikram Vij



Chef, restaurateur and TV personality Vikram Vij shares his secrets of eating local while on the go.


- FRESH FARE: Farmers markets are an amazing go-to for picking up something fresh, local and delicious and just eating it while you walk along, exploring more of the produce our province has to offer.
- ETHNIC EATS: One of my favourite things is walking through the Punjabi district on Main around 49th. It feels like home: less livestock, but the same colour, bustle and some incredible treats you can pick up at stores and food outlets. When I buy there, the food rarely makes it home.

BRICKS AND MORTAR

These neighbourhood pick-up pitstops offer anything but "fast food."

West End: On the way to the beach at English Bay, stop at the walk-up window of Beach Bay Café for takeaway fish 'n' chips, available year-round.

Mount Pleasant: Get an oyster po'boy sandwich to go at



Chinatown: Fetch Kiosk, in the stately Old Electric Building, has a service window from which to order an Irish BLT or apple pulled pork. Gastown: Tacofino's Burrito Bar is a strictly takeout spot where you can order the likes of a chorizo burrito (or stay in and have a Michelada at the Tacofino Taco Bar).

Granville Island: Edible Canada's takeout window includes such must-try delicacies as duck fat frites and poutine.

INDULGE: Sample eats from Vancouver's food trucks gathered at the Vancouver Art Gallery during Street Food City, part of the annual Dine Out[™] Vancouver Festival from January 19 to February 4.

Rent an electric bike at EzeeRiders Bike Rentals or one of the blue Mobi By Shaw Go bikes (they're part of the city's new public bike-share system) and follow the waterfront from the Vancouver Convention Centre around Stanley Park, past Science World and Granville Island to Kitsilano Beach.

Pitstop: Right on the waterfront at Granville Island, stop at Dockside Restaurant, which serves up seafood staples like crab and shrimp cakes.

Harder: English Bay is the seaside hub of Vancouver's West End and just one in a string of downtown-area beaches. Take the Sunset SUP (that's stand-up paddleboarding) with Ecomarine Paddlesport Centres for a seal's view of the city's beaches.

Nightcap: Sip seasonal craft beers, like the Stanley Park WinterGlow, from a water-view seat at the Bayside Lounge, an old-schoolmeets-hipster cocktail bar in the Best Western Plus Sands Hotel.



ATOP A MOUNTAIN

Easy: Take in Vancouver's mix of sea, city and peaks from a seaplane on **Harbour Air Seaplanes**' Panorama tour. Or set up a custom chopper tour of the North Shore mountains with **Helijet International**.

Pre- or post-flight: Watch planes from the Vancouver Convention Centre while sipping a local East Side Bitter at Mahony & Sons Public House. For the best view of Vancouver, do the Grouse Grind. A rigorous rite of passage for fit locals (the record is 23:48), this straight-up 2.9-km hike climbs 853 metres of altitude alongside the **Grouse Mountain** Super Skyride (the easy route).

Harder:

Refuel: Early start atop **Grouse Mountain Resort** in summer? Have breakfast with the rescued grizzlies, Grinder and Coola.

BE PREPARED: Before you head out on a hike, make sure you have the safety essentials with you, including water, extra clothes, a flashlight and a first aid kit.

LOCAL INTEL

Eoin Finn



The yogi, surfer and blissologist has been practising yoga since 1989. Marrying his love for athletics with yoga, Finn has also trained more than 100 Olympians and pro athletes. Here are Finn's fave places to find solitude in nature:

- THE TOP OF GROUSE MOUNTAIN: Sure, lots of people check their time at the top after the long walk up, but I like to lose track of time and meditate alone up there taking in the beauty of the ocean, mountains, forests and our great city.
- MUSEUM OF ANTHROPOLOGY AT UBC: These cliffs are magical. To do yoga around such huge totem poles and nature really reconnects us to our source.
- KITS BEACH LAWN: Finding my stillness amidst the joy of volleyball players, swimmers and sunbathers, along with a view of the sun setting over Vancouver Island, is sheer bliss.
- LIGHTHOUSE PARK, WEST VANCOUVER: It feels like worlds away from the city. I love doing yoga watching our beautiful city skyline and Mount Baker while curious seals swim by and check out my poses.



Harder: The North Shore is known worldwide as a mecca for yearround mountain biking, with a vast network of trails on Cypress Mountain (5th Horseman, Trunk Monkey, Shore Play) and Fromme Mountain (Pipeline, Expresso, 7th Secret) – and killer views while blazing downhill.

Go beyond: For bike clinics and lift access to spectacular terrain at one of the world's best mountain bike parks, go to Whistler Blackcomb Mountain. For flatter terrain, take a guided cycle tour with Into the Wild and hit the Trans Canada Trail on two wheels.

SNOW SCENE: In winter, ski, snowboard or snowshoe those summer bike trails at Cypress Mountain. From 1,440 metres, at the top of Mt. Strachan, you'll have the diorama-like city and Strait of Georgia spread before you.

WALK ON WATER: The Capilano Suspension Bridge lets you tread 137 metres across and 70 metres above what the Squamish Nation call Kia'palano, or "beautiful river." Explore more of the canyon on the Cliffwalk.

Easy: Stanley Park, Vancouver's

ancouver is virtually an island oasis surrounded by inlets, bays and rivers that all flow into the Pacific Ocean. Even downtown with its glittering glass towers is framed by sandy beaches, urban forests and a ring of walking and cycling paths that offer easy access to the water. Stroll the seawall, perch on a bridge or put your toes in the sand and watch the scene of stand-up paddlers, sailors and kayakers drift by. Join them and explore Vancouver by water.

KEEP YOUR FEET DRY

Hunt for treasure: Set sail from Granville Island with Pirate Adventures and join the captain and crew of salty characters in search of treasure in False Creek. Kids

and adults get the full pirate treatment, with face-painting and pirate attire. Time for a selfie? Tag it: #veryvancouver

Ride a ferry: You can explore museums, sporting venues and neighbourhood bars and boutiques, all by water. A fleet of little ferries buzzes back and

forth along False Creek, stopping at neighbourhoods and attractions such as Science World British Columbia, Vancouver Maritime Museum and Granville Island. Take a minitour on board Aquabus Ferries (its Cyquabuses take bikes) or get a day pass on False Creek Ferries.

MAKE A SPLASH

Take a dip: In summer, stretches of sandy beaches are buzzing with activity, but the water can be a bit brisk for some swimmers. Two heated outdoor pools chase the chill away: the 137-metre saltwater Kitsilano Pool (ideal for laps or lounging on deck) and the 80-metre Second Beach Pool in Stanley Park, which has a slide. **Go underwater:** Explore clear waters teeming with plumose anemones, octopuses and sponges on a diving or snorkelling adventure with **Sea Dragon Charters**. Board the TopLine at Horseshoe Bay and head to B.C.'s newest artificial reef, the *HMCS Annapolis*, just 20 minutes away in Halkett Bay.

TAKE OFF

Get hooked: Practice your saltwater angling with Bites-on Salmon Charters, which offers guided salmon fishing excursions from downtown.

Or go east with **Great River Fishing Adventures** or **STS Guiding Services** to catch (and release) a Fraser River sturgeon or fly fish for trout. Avid angler? Take a fly-tying course with **Pacific Angler**.

Go wild: Visit a colony of harbour seals sunning themselves on Pam Rocks in Howe Sound; it's just one of the experiences on **Sewell's Marina** sea safari. Adventures start at Horseshoe Bay where guests don survival suits and board an inflatable boat to "hunt" for wildlife.

For an urban expedition, take off with **Sea Vancouver** on a Zodiac that zips along Vancouver's inner harbour and beyond reaching speeds of 55 km/hour.

EAGLE ALERT: Look for the bald eagle nest high up in a tree by the Burrard Civic Marina in Vanier Park.

GOOD TO KNOW: Forgot your swimsuit? Go au naturel at clothingoptional Wreck Beach.

MORNING

Salute the sun with a 90-minute stand-up paddling yoga class. Vancouver Water Adventures offers morning sessions on the calm waters off Kitsilano Beach. It's a #veryvancouver way to start the day.

AFTERNOON

Peddle the peaceful waters of False Creek on **BC Water Bikes** launching from Vanier Park. Or helm your own dinghy and sail to behemoth ships anchored in English Bay.



RECHARGE: Slurp down some briny bivalves at Chewies Steam & Oyster Bar.

SUNSET

Kayak through water gleaming with phosphorescence from the light of the full moon. **Ecomarine Paddlesports Centres** leads tours from both English Bay and Jericho Beach and **Deep Cove Kayak** takes paddlers up Indian Arm.



WIND DOWN: Sip a local craft beer at The Three Brits Public House at the foot of Davie and Denman streets.

Jon Shaw's Icey Chomp

Meander three markets, each with a distinctive atmosphere.

 Gourmet goods: For wellfinished fineries, demos and tastings, head to Circle Craft Market. Every November curated selections in pottery, glassblowing, leatherwork and more fill the Vancouver Convention Centre with tempting gifts. Look for collaged quilts by Lorna Moffat, birch bark–styled tableware by Sophia Kim and lunar pendants by metalsmith Jessie Phoenix.

2 A pint while you ponder: In an upbeat atmosphere of music, beer and food trucks, Make It! The Handmade Revolution, hosted at the Pacific National Exhibition (PNE), showcases collections from 250 local crafters. During the annual event in April, Look for funky mixed-media prayer flags by Judy Mojo, pop-bright bowls by FeltCandy and screen printed tees by Ole Originals.

3 Footprints in the sawdust: Meet the makers face-to-face by joining 20,000 other curious collectors on the Eastside Culture Crawl in November when more than 400 artists open their studios. Heather Braun Dahl, for instance, showcases her Dahlhaus colour-

CUSTOMS & BORDER CROSSING INFO

> Canada Customs Entry Regulations

Citizens or permanent residents of the United States require a U.S. passport to enter Canada. Proof of residence, such as a driver's licence, should also be carried. However, this is not accepted as proof of citizenship. Visit *cbsa-asfc.gc.ca* for details. All international visitors must be in possession of a valid national passport and, in some cases, a visa (check with your local Canadian consulate or embassy).

> Returning or Travelling to the United States

U.S. and Canadian citizens are required to have a passport at all entry points if entering the U.S. Find up-to-date information at *dhs.gov* and *travel.state.gov*. Each visitor over the age of 19 may import to Canada, duty-free: 1.14 litres (40 oz.) of liquor or wine or 8.5 litres (288 oz. or 24 bottles) of beer and 50 cigars, 200 cigarettes and 200 grams (7 oz.) of manufactured tobacco. TRAVELLING WITH PETS

All pets coming to Canada must be accompanied by their owners. Each pet must have a certificate from a licensed American or Canadian veterinarian clearly stating that it has been vaccinated against rabies in the previous 36 months; otherwise the pet will not be let into Canada. *inspection.gc.ca*

Tourists with a valid licence can drive in B.C. for up to 6 months from another province, state or country, or up to 12 months if they also hold an International Driver's Permit issued outside of Canada.

The use of safety belts, child safety seats, bicycle helmets and motorcycle helmets is mandatory in British Columbia.

> Bank Machines/Credit Cards

Most bank machines in Metro Vancouver offer service on the Plus, Cirrus and Interac networks. They also generally accept credit card withdrawals. If you use your credit card to get cash from an ATM, the currency exchange is automatically done for you at the rate your credit card company offers. Vancouver welcomes all major credit cards.

> Tipping

Tips or service charges are not often added to a restaurant bill in Canada. Tipping your server at a bar, restaurant, nightclub or pub is standard practice. A tip of 15 to 20 per cent of the pre-tax amount is suggested. Porters at airports, railway stations and hotels are generally given \$1 to \$2 per bag.

> Taxes

A federal goods and services tax (GST) of five per cent applies to most purchased goods and services. In addition, a provincial sales tax (PST) of seven per cent is applicable to most retail purchases except liquor, which is taxed at 10 per cent.

The original tourism bureau (now called Tourism Vancouver) was created "for the purpose of making the attractions of Vancouver known to those in search of health and pleasure and also for the purpose of making strangers in the city feel welcome."

Touchdown! The **BC Lions** win the Canadian Football League's Grey Cup, the team's first. (The Leos win it five more times, in 1985, 1994, 2000, 2006 and 2011.)

1970

Face off! **The Vancouver Canucks** play its first game in the National Hockey League at the Pacific Coliseum, which is part of the **Pacific National Exhibition (PNE)**.

1983

BC Place stadium opens as the world's largest air-supported dome. (It now has a retractable roof.)

Vancouver celebrates its centennial and hosts Expo '86, the six-month-long World Exposition on Transportation and Communication. The SkyTrain, Canada Place, Vancouver Convention Centre, BC Place stadium and Science World British Columbia were built for the fair.
